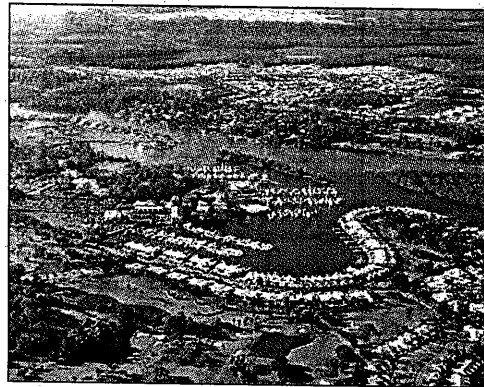
IT APPEARS the business boffins out at Sanctuary Cove have been mulling over who to select as their computer boffins recently.
